Ohatch Cincinnati has certainly had a season of IMPACT! Over the last few months, they've hosted a nonprofit recognition event, a canned food drive, and a toy collection for Toys for Tots' 75th Anniversary.

These impact efforts have been largely led by Becca West, who just received a new promotion to Senior Community Manager. Becca has been with COhatch for just over one year serving our Mason location. Prior to COhatch, Becca obtained her bachelor's degree in sports marketing and held a variety of roles in that industry. Ultimately, she left the world of sports, seeking a better work/life balance and to have more time to spend with family.

As a Community Manager, Becca has been empowered to run her location as her own. As a big people person, she loves interacting with COhatch members and Impact Scholars on a daily basis. The first nonprofit she signed up for our GIVE Scholarship was The Joe Nuxhall Miracle League. She took this as a sign that she was in the right place after leaving a career in sports since she was

immediately able to combine her passion for sports with helping others.

With Becca's new promotion, she now gets one full day each week to work on Cincinnati's Impact initiatives. This looks like planning events, creating processes for tracking applications, and connecting with our scholars regularly, making sure they have access to all the resources we provide. Becca loves educating the Cincinnati community about our Impact Programs, connecting them to organizations that align with each of their values.

When Cincinnati leadership was asked about Becca and her new role, she received some shining reviews. "During a recent tour, Becca was pulling out the names of Impact Scholars, not just from Mason, but from every location. She's shown a huge heart for impact and has always wanted to be involved at a higher level. She goes above and beyond to care for scholars in Cincinnati, so her promotion and area of expertise was a very natural progression," said Cincinnati Market Leader, Megan Dotzauer.

"The constant feedback we get from members and scholars stems from Becca and all she's doing for our Impact Community. She has a huge attention to detail and organization when it comes to our impact processes, which makes it so easy and smooth for Megan and I to come in and review applications," said Cincinnati Operations Leader, Robyn Kueper.

It's not just our GIVE Scholars that Becca is passionate about, but our BOOST Scholars, too. She's planning monthly events, like networking meetups or coffee chats, for the startup community here at COhatch. The Cincinnati team is hopeful these will all lead up to a pitch event at the end of the year.

Becca is a great relationship builder. She loves meeting with scholars in person to give them the right first impression and make sure they fully understand everything we have to offer. She's not only a great Community Manager at one of our busiest locations, but she's a great leader and teammate, too. We're so glad to have her on the COhatch team!





Scholar SPOTLIGHT



Face to Face Fine Art, an Indianapolis GIVE Scholar, creates free hand-painted portraits of people who have passed away suddenly or tragically for their loved ones. Founder, D. Anne Jones, decided to start the organization after losing three important people in her life in just 60 days. Her goal is to aid people in the grieving process by encouraging them and giving them a lasting memorial for their loved ones so future generations will know who they were. Since starting her company, she lost her daughter from fentanyl poisoning, and many of the portraits she paints are of people who have also lost their lives to addiction, so she hopes to raise awareness for that as well.

Since the organization's founding in 2012, Anne has created 300 of these portraits and has written a book on grief. She's currently working on a second book and is planning to launch a podcast on grief and healing.

When the weather's nice at COhatch Zionsville, Anne loves working on the porch. She utilizes COhatch for presentations and meetings with clients, as well as applying for grants. She also plans to make good use of our podcast room in the future.

Meet Believe in Dreams, a Cleveland-based nonprofit dedicated to youth empowerment through providing local dream experiences for kids ages 5-18 at or near poverty who have survived non-medical adversity, such as experiencing abuse and neglect, being part of the foster care system, or having an incarcerated parent. The children are able to request places they'd like to go locally, something they'd like to do, and something they'd like to have, then volunteers

put together an individualized package for each child. For example, if a child wants to learn a musical instrument, Believe in Dreams will buy their instrument, get lessons for them, and provide transportation to those lessons at no cost to the family.

Last year was big for them – they were able to fulfill 118 dreams (they started in 2014 with just 8 dreams!). They also had their highest revenue yet and hired a Dream Coordinator. This year, they've created an advisory board called Friends BID for people who want to get involved, but don't have time to be on the board of directors, or who are rolling off of their 3-year board term and still want to be involved. Friends BID will help spread the word about Believe in Dreams and utilize their networks to help the organization. They also hosted their big annual fundraiser, Night of Dreams.

Executive Director, Katie Eichenauer, joined COhatch in June of 2022 and has found it to be a great fit. She loves the COhatch team (shout out to Jasmine and Megan), the planned activities that lead to meeting and networking with other members, and the variety of spaces for everything from board meetings to quick phone calls.

Revolution Church is a brand new church launching in Cleveland on Easter Sunday (April 9) 2023. The church, which already has 70 members, strives to lead people into a growing relationship with Jesus through discipleship and service of the community. Because of that mission, Revolution Church is big on community service and partnering with local nonprofits to give back.

They announced their launch in January 2022 and since then, have collected diapers and wipes to donate to a home for teenage mothers, put together feminine hygiene kits for the Boys and Girls Club of Greater Cleveland, partnered with the Cleveland Browns over the holidays to feed a few hundred people at the Northeast Recovery Association, and hosted a New Year's Eve Sneaker Ball at COhatch Beachwood. For their Sneaker Ball, they utilized the brewery space for adults, teens gathered in The Hive, and the sports simulator and meeting rooms were used for kids. The event gave parents the opportunity to go out while knowing their children were taken care of nearby.

This year, they're excited to launch on Easter Sunday and to start implementing their weekly programming. They also have a few students graduating who are receiving scholarships and they're excited to see them achieve great things.

John and Richard will utilize The Hive at COhatch Beachwood for Sunday morning worship and utilize the meeting rooms as classroom space. They love the convenient location and easy parking that the location provides for their members.

In 2018, Cleveland COhatch members, Bethany Studenic and ChiChi Nkemere, founded Enlightened Solutions, a 501(c)3 think tank focused on the problem of systemic injustice. The organization is a research, individual advocacy, and organizational change firm dedicated to creating, implementing and publishing research-based solutions that center around the lived experiences of diverse people.

In 2022, the organization worked with Mayor Bibb to pass legislation to launch the City of Cleveland Black Women and Girls Commission, which creates opportunities and improves quality of life for Black women and girls in the city.

In March of this year, they officially launched "Living for We," a bi-monthly podcast in collaboration with NPR/Ideastream Public Media. The series will explore the stories of Black women in the region and how systems marginalize them.

The organization was drawn to COhatch for its convenient location, vibe, and flexibility. Bethany and ChiChi consider themselves to be modern workers who don't need a full building, but instead prefer the flexibility, inclusivity, and fluidity COhatch provides. They love the accessibility for the community, as well as the space to brainstorm, host discussions, and check-in in person once or twice a week.

ack in August of 2022, COhatch Bannounced we're headed to five more cities as part of a new expansion plan. This plan included Charlotte, North Carolina. Not long after, COhatch CEO, Matt Davis, received a LinkedIn message from Garrett Tichy, founder of hygge coworking, which is based in Charlotte. It said, "Hey Matthew - I'm

the owner of hygge coworking. We have 5 locations in Charlotte, NC. I saw the recent news about your potential expansion to NC and would love to talk."

And that's how it all began.

Garrett Tichy hygge (pronounced hoo-gah) is hygge founder a coworking community unlike any other. Bright yellow and welcoming, every location has its own hygge flair, while also having an electric community of people around every corner. After visiting hygge, the team, and its members, it just made sense. COhatch and hygge could come together and bring a one-of-a-kind connected community ecosystem that benefits all members. After deciding to move forward, the COhatch team spent months working with the hygge team to

determine how the two comties would fit together. Bright green and bright yellow... what a combination, right? What made this even easier is that both COhatch and hygge have similar values. like having an impact across the communities, making sure members have an integrated work-life balance, and providing as many resources as possible to elevate members to be greater.

Today, COhatch and hygge are officially connected, which means that all COhatch members have access to hygge coworking spaces in Charlotte and vice versa. hygge members will receive access to COhatch Impact


Scholarships and COhatch+, too, which will allow both communities to grow and connect together


As for some hygge team members, like Garrett and Taylor Florio (previously hygge's

n Friday, January 6, COhatch hosted the official grand opening celebration for our first location in the sunshine state: COhatch Lakeland! We partnered with the city of Lakeland for their First Friday event and 500 people, including COhatch members, staff, and the local community, gathered to attend the festivities.

Located in downtown Lakeland at 211 East Main Street, this location features coworking seats, 31 private offices (including two corporate suites), a 40+ person event space, a podcast room, and free coffee, beer, and wine for members.

COhatch Lakeland's ribbon cutting featured speeches from Mayor Bill Muntz, Lakeland GIVE Scholar, Ed Diaz, Lakeland Chamber of Commerce President, Amy Wiggins, and President of the Puerto Rican Chamber of Commerce, Ana Rivera. Following the ribbon cutting, attendees participated in face painting, a community mural, a photo booth, caricatures, and more.

A few months before the event, DJ Mini Joe Carter contacted our Lakeland team with the desire to grow his business. His story was inspiring and his commitment to success was evident. DJ Joe has a self-proclaimed learning disability, but has never allowed it to hinder the love and passion he has for his business and the Lakeland community, which he has been part of for the last 19 years.

We knew we could use DJ Joe's help at the grand opening event, and when asked, he jumped right in! It felt like he was part of the team due to his level of commitment, colla-

boration, and enthusiasm. He took every opportunity to announce the location's opening to the community. Our team overheard Joe mentioning the new




location on more than


